This term has gone very quickly and fairly smoothly. During the first weeks, I enjoyed seeing the newcomers settling down well and enjoying being part of college life. It looks like they have been here for longer than a term al-ready! Learners from all classes have joined the Learners Board to share their work with others and discuss weekly topics. This continues to be one of the favourite parts of the week for most learners, it is stunning to observe how they all develop a feeling and awareness of belonging to the Life Skills community.



I would like to appreciate all staff who have worked very hard consistently to support all learners to re-engage in the college routine after the summer holidays.

We have already had a busy term with various educational trips in the community. In partnership with Fabrika, learners attended a workshop in the city and worked closely with artists. They created stunning art pieces for their art awards booklet. Some learners started their work taster sessions as gardeners with City Parks, working at Junk Food Project and at the Fab Cafe at Preston Tennis Club. We also started a litter picking project in the community and the local Co-op was so impressed that they donated litter-pickers!

In reconnection and engagement with nature, we have re-started a series of outdoor trips. For example, Room 7 went to Stanmer Park and room 6 went to Nymans. They created a 3D art work inspired by nature.

It was remarkable to see the re-start of the coffee mornings. 
