## **NSPCC**

### Our top tips are:

- 1. Start a conversation: An open and honest conversation is often the first step in keeping your child safe online. It also plays an important role in supporting them if something has gone wrong. Talk to your child about what has happened, how they feel about it, and what the next steps are for you to take as a family. Keeping your child in the loop about what you are going to do to resolve the situation can help them to feel in control of it and can help them to feel like they can come to you with any future problems.
- 2.Be curious, not furious: Remaining calm and asking questions like 'how did you get to that?' or 'what did you click on?' will help you to understand how the content has appeared in the first place. Children will often remember the immediate response from an adult remaining calm and open will show them that you are someone they can turn to for help.
- 3.Try not to place blame: It may be that your child has clicked on something by mistake or even gone looking for the content on purpose. Either way, it is still important to remain calm and be supportive.

Classes have been visiting different National Trust parks as part of the sustainability outdoor curriculum. Speak Out organised advocacy groups to discuss types of jobs, independence, options after college and likes and dislikes. 

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DVLSC registered in 2021-2022 to be part of B&H Inclusive Communication Charter. This is a benchmark for communication support in adult learning disability services.

In 2014 the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists developed the 5 Good Communication standards to ensure that services use an inclusive communication approach.

By being part of the charter, DVLSC agreed to implement all the standards. DVLSC was part of an audit for each individual strand. This included speaking with professionals, looking for evidences and observing lessons.

In August 2022 DVLSC was granted with the highest overall score of "excellent".

Communication is at the heart of our vision to support learners in their adulthood individually. We are already working to improve how better we can use an inclusive communication approach and support their communication.

### FRIENDS OF DOWNS VIEW SCHOOL & LINK COLLEGE

Friends of Downs View,

Thank you to the Friends committee for a productive meeting last month.

Further discussion took place about the school playground refurbishment which is our new project and will benefit all the young people on the school site.

There are five pieces of equipment currently being discussed by staff, as well as a wheelchair swing, although this would not be in the playground itself, but somewhere more accessible to the young people who would be using it.

Once final decisions have been made, a proper costing can be done. In addition to the equipment, a new safety surface for the playground will need to be laid and there is a retaining wall that needs repairing as part of the preliminary work.

The actual installation of the equipment will take 3-4 weeks and so would need to be completed over a Summer holiday.

We should have more details on the cost of the project and the phases of it after our next Friends meeting on 1st March.

Two smaller projects that we are delighted to be funding at the Link College are

- A Garden Project- the idea of Nick Sell, a teacher at the Link, to support the work on biodiversity and sustainability at the College and to create a space for students to enjoy and grow plants and herbs. We will fund the purchase of soil, compost, plants and tools and work should get underway on 1st April.
- Eco Shop Tania Banks, teacher in charge of sustainability at the Link is starting an Eco Shop which will provide meaningful work experience for Yr 12 students and we will be funding uniforms for the students. The hope is that the shop will become a 'pop up' across the sites and a refill station for household products.




