
Absence From School/College

Hello all,



We were given a talk by an Alumni, telling us about his life after college. He is currently volunteering with local cafes and a gardening placement. His talk was very well received by our Learners, who were inspired to ask many questions.

Additionally, Learners learnt about their rights as an adult to have their annual health checks, explore some of the tools used by Doctors at a check-up, and took part in role playing scenarios. 

This free course is for parents/carers of children with or without formal diagnoses of special educational needs and disabilities who want to know more about how to support their children in everyday life. Relatives, personal assistants and other carers are also welcome to attend. Jacqui Shepherd is an experienced teacher, lecturer and trainer in special needs, autism inclusion and disability, with a PhD in autism. She has a son with autism and severe learning difficulties who now attends the Life Skills College. She facilitates training for a range of education and care professionals, as well as parents and carers. She is also a governor at Downs View school.
